One of the king's chief men signified his agreement and went on to say "Your majesty, when we compare the present life of man on earth with that time of which we have no knowledge, it seems to me that man appears on earth for a little while but of what went before this life or what follows we know nothing. Therefore, if this Christian teaching has brought any certain knowledge, it seems only right that we should follow it."
